*Triple-bloom entry* ..... Class 269

One fully double bloom and two open-centered blooms.

**THREE DIFFERENT WATERLILIES** ..... Class 270

**THREE DIFFERENT ORCHIDS** ..... Class 271

**ONE EACH BALL, MB, POM** ..... Class 272

**PEOPLE'S CHOICE** ..... Class 273

*People's Choice will be selected by popular vote of the Public. Ballots will close Sunday at 2:00 p.m.  
No Limits. First entry of a variety takes precedent.*

**PUBLIC CLASS** ..... Class 274

Open to anyone who has never exhibited dahlias before. Intended for "walk-ins" bringing entries not conforming to Federation rules. Purpose is to encourage involvement in our hobby.

**VASE OF DAHLIAS** ..... Class 275

A vase of dahlias with or without greenery. A minimum of 7 dahlia blooms. A vase is a container taller than its width. No oasis or foam. No limit on the number of entries. Winners will be chosen by random drawing from all entries completing a white entry tag.

**DEFUNCT PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALL TEAMS**

- DALLAS TEXANS** ..... Class 301  
*Denied purchasing the Chicago Cardinals by the NFL, Lamar Hunt formed the AFL in 1960 and hired unknown Hank Stram to coach his new Dallas franchise. Deciding Dallas could not support two pro football teams, he moved his team to Kansas City, renamed as the Chiefs.*  
**A design with a western motif.**
- CHICAGO CARDINALS** ..... Class 302  
*Founded in 1898, a charter member of the NFL (1920). Moved to St. Louis (1960), then Arizona (1987). “New” uniforms in 1901 were old University of Chicago maroon ones, which had faded to “Cardinal Red.”*  
**A design using red.**
- PORTSMOUTH SPARTANS**..... Class 303  
*Founded in 1920, beat Green Bay 19-0 in 1932 using only 11 players the entire game. Moved to Detroit in 1934 and renamed the Lions.*  
**A mass design.**
- HOUSTON OILERS** ..... Class 304  
*In 1993, leading Buffalo by 32 points in the 3rd quarter, the Oilers lost in overtime, victim to the NFL’s largest comeback. Eventually moved to Tennessee (1999) and renamed the Titans. Logo was an oil derrick.*  
**A vertical design.**
- PORTLAND STORM** ..... Class 305  
*The last team formed in the World Football League (1974). Name change to Thunder (1975) didn’t help the low attendance and team folded. (I was living in Vancouver and was one of the few attendees).*  
**A design using water.**
- ST. LOUIS RAMS** ..... Class 306  
*The Rams were in Los Angeles (1946 to 1993) and returned to Los Angeles in 2016. (Also only team to win NFL championships in three different cities: Cleveland (1945), Los Angeles (1951), and St. Louis (1999).*  
**A design utilizing two containers.**
- MIAMI SEAHAWKS**..... Class 307  
*A charter team of the All-American Football Conference in 1946. After one season, assets were confiscated by the league and sold to the original Baltimore Colts, which folded in 1950. (Name was revived in 1953.)*
