### **DRIVING DIRECTIONS**

South Hill Mall, 3500 South Meridian, Puyallup

**From the North:** Highway 167 becomes Highway 512. Take 512 to the top of the hill, south of the Fairgrounds. Exit right on 94th Avenue, proceed to 9th Avenue SW. Turn left onto Perimeter Road, pass Sears and Competitive Edge Fitness on the right. The road bears right at the brick wall. Continue to the right to the parking area behind the Theatre. Enter through doors that lead into the mall. You should see Penney's across the aisleway. WSDS tables start at the junction of aisleways and to the left.

**From the South:** Exit I-5 to Highway 512. Continue on 512, for about 8 miles, take the 9th St SW/94th Ave E Exit. Continue straight through the traffic light, turn left at the Mall sign, passing Sears and Competitive EDGE Fitness on the right, When the road bears to the right continue to the right to the parking area at the Mall entrance. Enter through doors that lead into the mall. You should see Penney's across the aisleway. WSDS tables start at the junction of aisleways and continue to the left to Center Court.

**WASHINGTON STATE ATTRACTIONS**

**MOUNT RAINIER**.....Class 301

*Mount Rainier is the tallest peak in the state (14,410 feet), located east of Puyallup, can be seen from miles in every direction.*

A Vertical design using white dahlias.

**SAN JUAN ISLANDS**.....Class 302

*Located north of Puget Sound, these are the best known of Washington's many islands with the four largest accessible by ferry.*

A Right-Angle design using water.

**LEAVENWORTH**.....Class 303

*The town of Leavenworth proudly recognizes itself as a "Bavarian Village" and has a popular holiday light festival in December.*

A design of your own interpretation.

**MOUNT SAINT HELENS**.....Class 304

*When Mount St. Helens erupted on May 18, 1980, it reduced its peak by 1,300 feet and leveled much of the surrounding area, spewing ash 13 miles into the air.*

A Hogarth or S-Curve design using dahlias in a variety of colors.

**MUSEUM OF GLASS**.....Class 305

*The Museum of Glass features exquisite, translucent pieces by world-renowned artist and Tacoma native, Dave Chihuly.*

An Asymmetrical Triangle design using dahlias in a variety of colors, incorporating glass in your design.

**WASHINGTON STATE CAPITOL BUILDING**.....Class 306

*The grand white dome of the capitol building rises 287 feet above the tree-lined streets and center of Olympia. Dahlias are planted on the capitol grounds in the Sunken Garden*

An Inverted T design, using pastel dahlias.

Arrangements shall not be wider than 24 inches, unless otherwise noted.

Each exhibitor may enter a maximum of one entry per class.
