Tacoma Trial Garden

The Pacific Northwest Trial Garden (commonly known as the Tacoma Trial Garden) is maintained in cooperation with the Washington State Dahlia Society. The garden is located within Point Defiance Park, which includes a zoo, aquarium, rose and rhododendron gardens, and a large network of hiking trails and beaches. You will have the opportunity to score seedlings during your visit.

Location: 5400 North Pearl Street, Tacoma, WA. From the main entrance, follow the road to the left and proceed to the area behind the rose garden. Parking spaces are along the road.

Box lunches will be provided. Restrooms are available.

Dahlia gardens in the Wenatchee area and Rocky Reach Dam. The first stop is Rocky Reach Dam on the Columbia River, where a presentation on hydro-electric power will be given. You will stroll the grounds and see their dahlia garden. Lunch is included with the tour.

We will also visit the Chelan Butte Dahliary. This working farm is in its fifth year in North Central Washington and features about 5,000 dahlia plants and 800 varieties of every description. Owned and operated by North Central Washington Dahlia Society members (and former Puget Sound Dahlia Association members) Lindsay & Scott Williams. We will return to the Wenatchee Convention Center by 5 pm.

Sunday – September 8, 2024
